/// PREFACE ///

Lanka Mahavidyalaya was established on the 20th July, 1979 in the northern outskirts of Lanka town which is situated in the southernmost part of the district Hojai, Assam. Lanka is situated at a distance of about 180 Km. from Guwahati, the Capital city of Assam and about 17.2 Km. from Hojai, the District Headquarter town. The site where the college stands today spreads over an area of about 17 Acres amid green surroundings.

Lanka Mahavidyalaya is an affiliated college of Gauhati University and from the academic session 2024-25 it is affiliated to Rabindranath Tagore University. It offers Higher Secondary (10+2) and Four Year Under Graduate Programme (FYUGP) in Arts and Commerce Streams. Lanka being a backward area, there was no institution of Higher Education within a distance of 20 Km. of Lanka before the establishment of Lanka Mahavidyalaya and a vast majority of students could not afford Higher Education due to financial constraint. As the college community has been exerting its sincere and untiring efforts to enlighten the economically and educationally backward people of the area, the scenario has changed for the better to a greater extent.

The college started its mission with only 130 students at Lanka High School premises. It was shifted in 1982 to its present site which spreads over a sprawling area amid green surroundings. At present the college is having a total strength of more than 2400 enrolments which reflects the progress of the Institution day by day.

The college has been Accredited 'B' Grade by the National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC) in February 2005, November 2015 and in March 2024.

Important Points:

1. If a student opts to exit after completion of 1st year, s/he may be awarded a **UG Certificate** with a minimum of 40 credits earned. In addition to that, the student will require to complete a mandatory vocational course of 4 credits during summer vacation of first year.
2. If a student opts to exit after completion of 2nd year, s/he may be awarded a **UG Diploma** with a minimum of 80 credits earned. In addition to that, the student will require to complete a mandatory vocational course of 4 credits during summer vacation of second year.
3. If a student opts to exit after completion of either 1st year or completion of 2nd year, s/he may be allowed to **re-enter within three years** and complete the degree programme **within the stipulated maximum period of seven years**.
4. If a student opts to exit after completion of 3rd year securing 120 credits, s/he will be eligible for **UG degree with Major discipline without Honours**.
5. For **Four-Year Honours degree** the major subject/discipline requires 80 credits and the minor subject/discipline requires 32 credits. The student who exits after completion of 6th Semester/3rd Year, s/he requires 60 credits in the major subject/discipline and 24 credits in the minor subject/discipline.
6. Students who **intend to complete Four-Year degree programme will have two options in 7th and 8th semesters**:
 - i) Students who choose Research in 4th year are to study DSC-16, DSC-17 and DSC-18 of 4 credits each and to complete a dissertation/project of 4 credits mandatorily in 7th semester.
Accordingly, in 8th semester these students will study DSC-19, DSC-20 of 4 credits each and to complete a dissertation/project of 8 credits.
 - ii) Students who don't choose Research will study DSC-21*, DSC-22* and DSC-23* mandatorily in lieu of dissertation/project in 7th and 8th semester in addition to (DSC-16 to DSC-20) leading to Honours without Research.
7. Students who will complete Four-Year degree programme **with dissertation/project** will be awarded Bachelor Degree of Honours with Research, and students who will complete Four-Year degree **without dissertation/project** will be awarded Bachelor Degree of Honours.

SELF FINANCING CERTIFICATE / DIPLOMA / DEGREE COURSES UNDER KRISHNA KANTA HANDIOUE STATE OPEN UNIVERSITY

K.K. Handique State Open University has approved for setting up a Study / Examination Centre in Lanka Mahavidyalaya from the Academic Session 2013-14. Courses offered are BPI, Diploma Courses, BA, B.Com, M.A, M.COM under KKHSOU. The detailed notice regarding Opening / Admission etc. of the Courses offered by the KKHSOU will be notified in due course.

ELIGIBILITY OF ADMISSION

Applicants who have passed the H.S.L.C. Examination or any other equivalent Examination recognized by Assam State School Education Board (ASSEB) are eligible for admission into Higher Secondary First Year Class.

Admission to B.A. / B.Com. First Semester class is open for those who passed the H.S. (10+2) Examination in Arts / Commerce / Science Stream conducted by the ASSEB or CBSE or any other equivalent examination recognized by the Rabindranath Tagore University.

PROCEDURE OF ADMISSION

- The admission is online.
- Admission to the college shall be based strictly on MERIT.
- Only those students who satisfy the eligibility criteria as determined by Assam Higher Secondary Education Council and Rabindranath Tagore University for Higher Secondary and Degree Courses respectively will be eligible for the admission.
- Minimum qualifying marks for opting for a major by a student of his / her choice is 40% in the concerned subject and overall 45% marks in his / her last qualifying examination.
- Applicants seeking admission into Four Year Under Graduate Programme (FYUGP) offered by the college should go through the web portal <https://assamadmission.samarth.ac.in>. Thereby the applicants are also directed to download the prospectus and read it thoroughly before filling the online application.



- F. Applicants seeking admission in H.S. 1st Year should follow the darpan portal <https://darpan.ahseconline.in> & www.lankamahavidyalaya.in
- G. A student desiring admission must submit his / her duly filled in admission form within the stipulated date, as fixed by the College authority. Incomplete and delayed submission of application forms will be summarily rejected without intimation to the candidate. Merit List & Date of Admission will be notified soon on the college website after the completion of verification process.
- H. The applicants shall have to upload Marksheet, Caste Certificate, Certificate from the Head of the Institution last attended, Admit Card, Income Certificate issued by Circle Officer/ Ration Card issued by Competent Authority (for Free Admission) and other relevant documents along with the application.
- I. At the time of admission, the candidate shall have to produce the following original documents before the Admission Committee.
 - i) Original marksheet of the last qualifying examination.
 - ii) Original certificate from the Head of the Institution last attended.
 - iii) Admit Card of the last qualifying examination
 - iv) Caste Certificate.

STUDENTS CLASS ATTENDANCE //

The College takes students' Class Attendance strictly for the purpose Of allowing students for appearing in the final examinations as per Rules of ASSEB/ RTU and for Credit Point / Marks, Academic Awards, Scholarships and contesting in Students' Association Elections etc.

A minimum of 75% of total classes held in each subject separately in an academic session is obligatory to sit for the University/ Council examinations as a regular candidate. Minimum of 60% attendance is necessary to appear at the examinations as Non-Collegiate candidate for H.S. examination/ University examination. Attendance below 60% will render a student Dis-collegiate and such students are not eligible to appear in the final examinations of the Council/ University.

EXAMINATION / EVALUATION (INTERNAL) //

Attendance in Unit Tests, Departmental Examinations, Preparatory Test, Sessional Examinations, Home Assignments, Project work, Seminar, Workshop etc. conducted in the college is compulsory. No application seeking exemption from appearing at the examination will be entertained. Students failing to pass Test Examination will not be allowed to appear in Final Examination.

THE COLLEGE LIBRARY //

The Library of the College is well organized. There are about 18,124 volumes covering all the subjects including Text Books and Reference Books. The Library has two special reading rooms, one for the students and another for the teachers. There are some journals and newspapers subscribed by the Library. The Library remains open from 10 A.M. to 5 P.M. on all working days. The College Library rules are framed in keeping with University. Library Rules and books are catalogued in Dewy Decimal Classification system.



RELEVANT RULES FOR THE COLLEGE LIBRARY //

- Library is for the use of both the Students and Teachers.
- There are certain books not to be taken out of the Library. Students can use these books in the reading room of the Library.
- Library cards are issued to a student as follows.

- A student shall have to return a borrowed Book within 15 days from the date of issue. If a student requires the book for more than the aforesaid period, he / she shall have to renew the book from the Librarian, failing which a fine of 50 paisa per day up to 15 days and Re.1.00 per day thereafter will be imposed on the borrower till the book is returned.
- If a student retains the book at a stretch after the scheduled date of return, ignoring the prevalent rule of the Library administration, he / she shall be liable to face disciplinary action, which may involve deprivation of right for getting further Library facility.
- A borrower shall be personally responsible for any loss or damage of books borrowed by him / her from the college library and has to replace such books by new ones.
